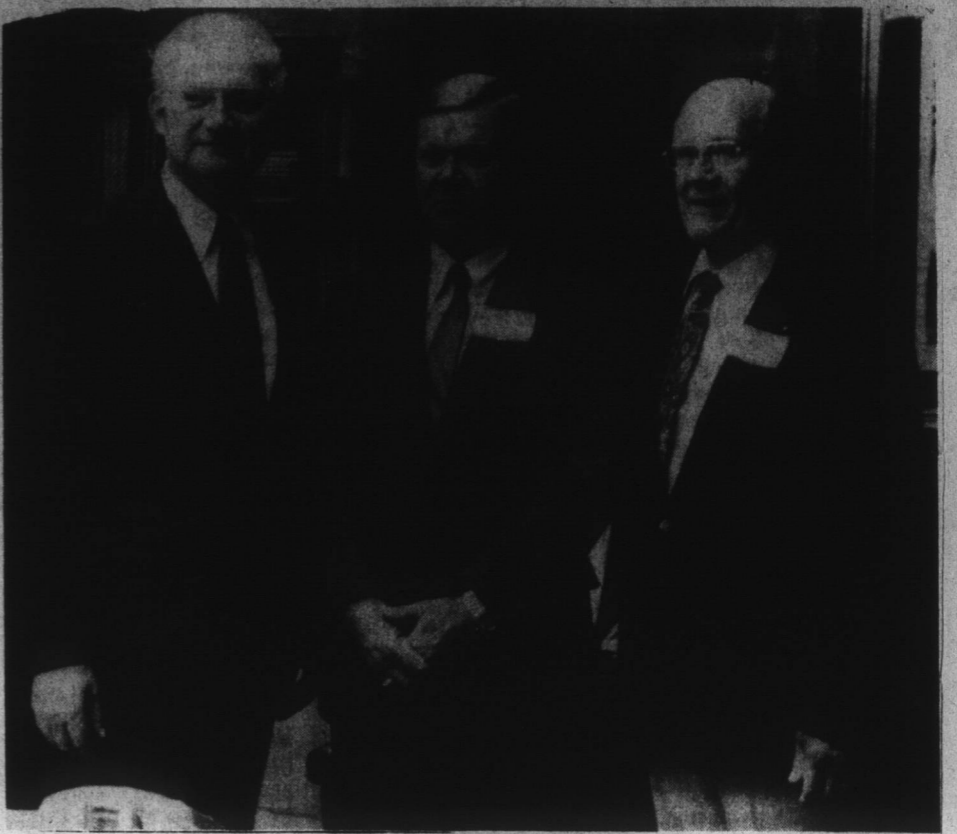
### Moore Completes Leadership Course
