Governor's Award For Fitness And Health Begins This Month

Gov. Jim Hunt today announced that competition for the Second Annual Governor's Award for Fitness and Health in Business and Industry begins this month. The competition is open to all North Carolina business and industrial firms and other employers.

Sponsored by Blue Cross and Blue Shield of North Carolina and the Governor's Council on Physical Fitness and Health, the award is designed to recognize employers who promote fitness and health for their employees at the work site and to encourage the development of such programs by other employers.

Forty North Carolina employers competed for the first award in 1981. Burroughs Wellcome Company was the winner of that first award.

"The caliber of the entries in the competition last year was outstanding," Gov. Hunt

said. "They showed that employers have a genuine interest and concern in their vision as business leaders."

"This year we are looking for even more programs that promote employee fitness at the work site," Hunt said. Thomas A. Rose, president of Blue Cross and Blue Shield of North Carolina, said, "Promoting health and fitness at the work site can go a long way toward helping hold down health costs as well as increasing productivity and decreasing absenteeism. Since healthier employees use fewer medical services, health and fitness programs at the work site may also have a favorable influence on the health insurance rates a company pays."

Employee programs implemented between October 1, 1981 and October 31, 1982 are eligible for this year's competition. Entries must be received by December 28.

The award will be presented by Gov. Hunt at a ceremony in Raleigh January 27. The award will go to the organization selected as having the best overall program promoting employee fitness. A panel of health and fitness experts will select the winning organization.

Crape Myrtles Given By Foundation

Free Crape Myrtles will be given by the National Arbor Day Foundation to new members joining during November, 1982.

The free Crape Myrtles are part of the Foundation's effort to promote fall tree planting.

"Fall is an excellent time to plant trees because the roots establish themselves over the winter and support faster tree growth in the spring," John Rosenow, foundation executive director, said. "The National Arbor Day Foundation is making this special offer because the advantages of fall planting are often overlooked."

Crape Myrtles can be pruned as 15-20 foot trees or as informal hedge. They have beautiful red blooms throughout the summer and early fall.

Two one-to-two foot trees will be shipped this fall, postage paid, with enclosed planting instructions. The trees are guaranteed to grow, or they will be replaced free by the Foundation.

The National Arbor Day Foundation, a nonprofit organization, is working to improve the quality of life throughout the country by encouraging tree planting. The Foundation will give two free Crape Myrtles to new members contributing \$10.00 or more during November.

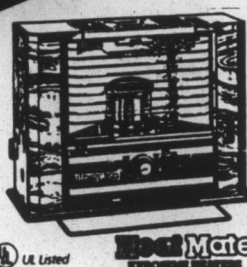
