

There it was sung by four sisters by the name of Strasser. This song became the favorite of the "Strasser quartet." They were invited to sing the hymn in the

cathedral of Leipzig. It became known as the 'Tyrolean Song.'' The song was first honored

in 1854 when a full choir sang it in the imperial church of Berlin before Emperor Frederich Wilhelm IV. Thereafter it was ordered to have first place in all Christmas programs. Translated into English, the

song begins: "Silent night, holy night," the most beautiful of Christmas songs to be sure.


