VA Loan Changes To Help Veterans **Buy Homes** 

The Veterans Administr tion is changing its Loan **Guaranty Regulations to** make it easier for veterans to buy retirement homes to participate in local housing programs where there are income restrictions. Over the past several years, various state and local

governments have developed housing programs designed to sons of low and moderate income. Restrictions, such as rights of first refusal or agreements to forfeit excess sale proceeds in the event of sale are imposed to assure that the program benefits accrue only to the targeted beneficiaries. Amending these regulations now allows VA to participate in these programs. The decision to guarantee loans on homes where there are restrictions on the ages of residents or owners will allow **VA** loans in retirement developments where the program has been of limited value up to now and will open up new possibilities to World War II veterans who still have loan entitlement. The amended regulations apply for both conventional homes and mobil homes when the veteran is using the GI Home Loan program. Details about these changes are available at any VA regional office nationwide.
