**Riddick Earns Honors**

First place honors went to Ernest Riddick in the Eastern Regional Wrestling Tournament in Goldsboro on Saturday. Riddick, a 235 pound heavy weight, defeated Martin of Richmond County High School by a 12-2 decision in the quarter finals. He won against Elliott from Cape Fear High, 9-1. In the championship finals, the Aces senior pinned Milligan of Hogard High School. Milligan was the top seeded wrestler from the Fayetteville Sectionals.

Last week in the Greenville Sectional Tournament, Riddick won 3 matches, pinning each of his opponents. He won the first place medal in the Sectionals for the second straight year.

Undefeated Riddick, 20-0, and Coach Randy Hollowell travel to Winston-Salem to the State Wrestling Tournament today (Thursday). Competition begins at 10:00 A.M. Friday, culminating in the Championship Finals, Saturday evening.

**1983 Annual Truck Registration Renewals Are Being Updated By The Division Of Motor Vehicles**

**RALEIGH** — The N.C. Department of Transportation's Division of Motor Vehicles (DMV) is in the process of updating 1983 annual truck registration renewals. In reviewing this process, it was determined that some truck owners might have overlooked the fact that annual truck renewals were required to be completed by midnight, February 15.

The review also found 1983 truck renewal cards that were mailed indicated a 15-day grace period. This is in error since all annual truck renewals for trucks licensed for 5,000 lbs. gross weight and above should have been completed by February 15, 1983. These vehicles, operating after February 15, must display 1983 tags. Vehicles which are not currently registered for 1983 would ordinarily be issued a citation for 1983 license fees and assessed a civil penalty, according to DMV officials.

Commissioner of Motor Vehicles R. W. Wilkins, Jr. stated, however, that, "The civil penalty for North Carolina-registered vehicles

will be waived during the period of February 16, 1983 through March 2, 1983 at midnight provided the necessary registration fees for 1983 are paid. We have taken this action since the registration renewal cards could have been misleading. This would, in no way, relieve the owner of the normal fees assessed for the truck registration or overweight penalties.

"If a trucker is stopped without up-to-date plates between now and midnight on March 2, he would be required to pay registration fees at that time but not assessed the civil penalty."

Wilkins noted that more than 97 per cent of the truck owners involved have already renewed their registrations prior to the February 15th deadline and are not affected by this process.

Action has already been taken to correct the printing process so that registration renewal cards printed for trucks registered for 5,000 lbs. and above will not show the 15-day grace period in the future, DMV officials said.

**RJ Reynolds Donates For Faculty Exchange Program**

The Veterans Administration has some suggestions to help students avoid delays in their VA education payments.

Every month 600,000 VA checks worth more than \$200-million are mailed to veteran students and to eligible dependents, and the agency wants to do everything possible to avoid delays.

In an attempt to avoid possible delays, the VA suggests the following:

\*When a student feels the initial payment for the school term has been delayed, he or she should check with the school to find out the date the enrollment certificate was sent to the VA. At least four weeks should be allowed from that date before an education check can be expected.

\*If an advance payment check is expected, the student should make sure the required written request was signed. The specific request for the advance money should have been submitted to VA at least a month before the beginning of the semester.

\*Students who have gotten education benefits in the past should consider whether an overpayment is outstanding. If an overpayment exists, current benefits are withheld until the overpayment is recovered by the VA.
