

The Washington Report

Many people in this country are always referring to the "confusion" that exists in our Nation's Capitol on a daily basis. However, in this connection never has there been a greater confusion than this past weekend, February 11, when Washington, D.C. received one of the heaviest snowstorms in its history. For example, on Friday when the snow was beginning to make itself known, the federal agencies announced that they would continue to operate on a normal basis, and federal employees in Maryland and Virginia were hard put to get to work, some taking up to two hours to come just a short distance. Strangely enough, when arriving in their normal place of business, they were then told they could go home! For all practical purposes, the city was paralyzed for approximately three days. I live on a street that normally has a reasonably heavy amount of traffic, but on Saturday and Sunday, due to the heavy snow of 18 to 20 inches, hardly a car or truck passed during the daylight hours.

Also during the past week I was invited down to Miami Beach to address the annual Convention of the AFL-CIO Maritime Trades Industry. Hoping to find some sunshine after the heavy snow, upon arrival I was greeted by a northeaster-heavy winds and rain plus tornado warnings being issued. As one famous philosopher has said, the weather is something everyone talks about but no one can do anything about it! It now appears that President Reagan, after threatening in 1982 to veto any type of

job training bill to help relieve unemployment, has now reached a spirit of compromise and has come out with his own proposal, which may or may not be accepted by the Democrats. But at least it does put the Congress in a position of negotiating with the White House, a situation which did not exist last year. With the massive unemployment of in excess of 10 million, this jobs program is estimated to cost from \$5 to \$8-billion and will certainly not solve the entire problem. But in this dire economic situation, I am sure the 400,000 or so who might be affected and able to find some relief will be most appreciative, and to say the least, it will take them off the welfare rolls and put them in the position of again being tax-paying citizens. The final details of public works and job training programs remain to be resolved, but at least we are at a starting point, and I think it is safe to predict that some type of program will be enacted during this session of Congress.

The House of Representatives passed two bills this week which were designed to make it easier for small businesses to obtain contracts with the federal government. The provisions within these bills basically streamline the processes for small business contractors working through the Small Business Administration. For example, one pilot program would authorize the Small Business Administration to waive normal federal bonding requirements for qualified contractors which are unable to obtain a surety bond from private sources. Another provision would require 15 days

notice before the government issues a solicitation for a contract in order to provide a small business adequate time to receive copies of the solicitation.

I regret there is not more legislative action to report, but the time-consuming chore of organizing Committees, makes the actual legislative process move rather slowly.

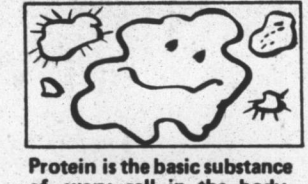

"The Year Of The Hog"

February 13 marked the beginning of the Chinese New Year, which is the Year of the Pig. In North Carolina, however, it's the Year of the Hog.

The North Carolina Pork Producers Association (NCPA) is taking advantage of this year to promote the state's profitable swine industry with a variety of activities. The most recent project is sponsorship of a North Carolina pork cooking team in the tenth annual World's Championship Barbecue Cook-Off, held in Houston, Texas as a part of the Houston Livestock Show and Rodeo.

The World's Championship Barbecue Cook-Off is a two-day event at the Houston Astrodome, drawing more than 100,000 people. Over 150 teams compete in the contest, and the winning team will compete in the second annual Pioneer Days contest on May 21-22 at the Charlotte Motor Speedway as a part of World 600 Week.

A cooking team made up of Mr. and Mrs. Willis Peaden, their son Kevin, and Mr. and Mrs. Jim Elder, all of Havelock, will leave Raleigh-Durham Airport on Friday, February 18 at 11 A.M. on Piedmont flight 357 to go to Houston to compete in this event. Al Daniel, president and acting executive secretary and Elaine Harvell,

representatives of the Charlotte Chamber of Commerce, Piedmont Airlines, Charlotte Hotel and Motel Lodging Association and the Charlotte Motor Speedway.

The North Carolina cooking team will sport colorful jackets embroidered with the slogan, "1983 - Year of the Hog," and will be taking 300 pounds of link sausage, a 110-pound dressed pig, and 300 pounds of pork ribs to be used during the competition.

As a promotional effort the North Carolina Pork Producers Association, air fare was supplied by Piedmont Airlines; lodging in Houston was sponsored by the Charlotte Hotel and Motel Lodging Association; and the pork was supplied by Dinner Bell and sponsored by Harris-Teeter.
