scale and pump used in trade in the state. Every year, inspectors from the weights and measures section of the Consumer Standards Division of the NCDA inspect every commercial measuring device for accuracy. If the device passes the test, it is sealed and the stamp of approval applied. If the device fails to pass the strict requirements, it is rejected and not released for

use until properly calibrated.

Spot checks are made from time to time to insure that once-passed devices still meet specifications, and also field inspectors from the NCDA visit establishments to investigate complaints on suspected irregularites reported by consumers. In one such case, a lumberyard in Mecklenburg County was recently brought to court by the NCDA for under paying by paying for less wood than they actually received.
