

DOUBLE VISION

If you have ever experienced double vision when you were tired or taking medication, you can appreciate how disturbing it can be. Sudden double vision without any apparent cause is very frightening indeed. But regardless of the cause, in simple terms it indicates that the two eyes are not pointing in the same

In the case of double vision due to fatigue or drugs, there is interference with the brain's ability to control and coordinate the eye muscles. Of course, this condition disappears with rest or the disuse of the medication. A more serious matter is double vision which occurs suddenly. without apparent cause, and is present constantly. In this case, you should seek medical attention immediately. Possible causes include a small stroke, a brain tumor, or a hemorrhage.

In most instances, medical treatment will gradually restore normal vision. In the meantime, special glasses can be made which eliminate this unsettling vision symptom.
