

One Tooth Can Matter

Maybe your teeth are free of decay and your gums are healthy, but you have one tooth right in the front of your mouth that's unattractive. It may be

chipped or discolored. Or maybe it's been twisted out of shape for some reason or is longer than it need to be. Don't let it detract from your appearance. Ask your dentist what can be done about it. A tooth that is longer

than it need be, for instance, can look like a "fang." It may even give you an "angry" look when you open your mouth. This tooth can be shortened and reshaped, and what a difference it will make in your smile! The same goes for a tooth that has been rotated or twisted out of shape. The problem may be that it doesn't blend symetrically with your other teeth. Your dentist can solve this problem for you.

Chipped or discolcred teeth can be unsightly, no matter where they happen to be in your mouth, but especially if they are up front where they show easily. Chips can be repaired, and discolored teeth can be bleached and colored to look natural again. Ask your dentist about it.
