Vets Still Receive Compensation

Out of the 39 million men and women who have served during wartime in the United States, 206 million served during our 206-year history. Three out of five—of 24.3 million—are living today. One out of eight of these survivors receives monthly Veterans Administration checks in the form of compensation or pension.

There are no veteran survivors of the Civil War, the War of 1812 or the Revolutionary War, but 53 veterans of the 392,000 who originally served in the Spanish-American War were living as of December 31, 1982. All but 12 are over 100 years old and each receives a VA check each month.

World War I's 4.7 million participants are represented today by some 600,000 surviving veterans (one of 13 who served and nearly two out of five living veterans of World War I are on the VA's compensation or pension rolls.

One Tooth Can Matter

Maybe your teeth are free of decay and your gums are healthy, but you have one tooth right in the front of your mouth that's unattractive. It may be chipped or discolored. Or maybe it's been twisted out of shape for some reason or is longer than it need to be. Don't let it detract from your appearance. Ask your dentist what can be done about it.

A tooth that is longer than it need be, for instance, can look like a "fang." It may even give you an "angry" look when you open your mouth. This tooth can be shortened and reshaped, and what a difference it will make in your smile! The same goes for a tooth that has been rotated or twisted out of shape. The problem may be that it doesn't blend symmetricaly with your other teeth. Your dentist can solve this problem for you.

Chipped or discolored teeth can be unsightly, no matter where they happen to be in your mouth, but especially if they are up front where they show easily. Chips can be repaired, and discolored teeth can be bleached and colored to look natural again. Ask your dentist about it.
