





Are Child's Teeth On Schedule?

somewhat like trains or airplanes. If they don't arrive on schedule, you (or rather your child) may be in for a problem. How do you know if the permanent teeth are replacing the primaries on schedule? Here's the "ballpark" timetable for you to use as a reference. Between the age of 71/2 to 10, he should have four permanent incisors in front as well as a primary canine, first and second molar, and a permanent 6-year molar on each side. This gives him a total of 12 teeth in each dental arch.

Children's teeth are

By the time he's 12, he should have lost the primary (baby) molars. The permanent premolars should have

worked their way through his gums to replace them. So should the permanent canine teeth. The last step is for all four 12-year molars to emerge behind

the 6-year molars. This should happen between the ages of 11 and 13. There is no exact "date" when all permanent teeth should be in. But there is a normal schedule of events. If your child is not "on schedule" there may be a problem. You'll need a dentist's help to correct
