"Recently legislation was introduced in the N.C. Senate to raise the salaries of commissioners and deputy commissioner serving on the N.C. Industrial Commission. I will oppose any and all legislation raising salaries for elected or appointed officials until such time as our teachers and state employees are granted an equitable raise."

Industrial commissioners currently make \$40,358. Deputy commissioners' salaries range from \$27,204-\$39,756.
