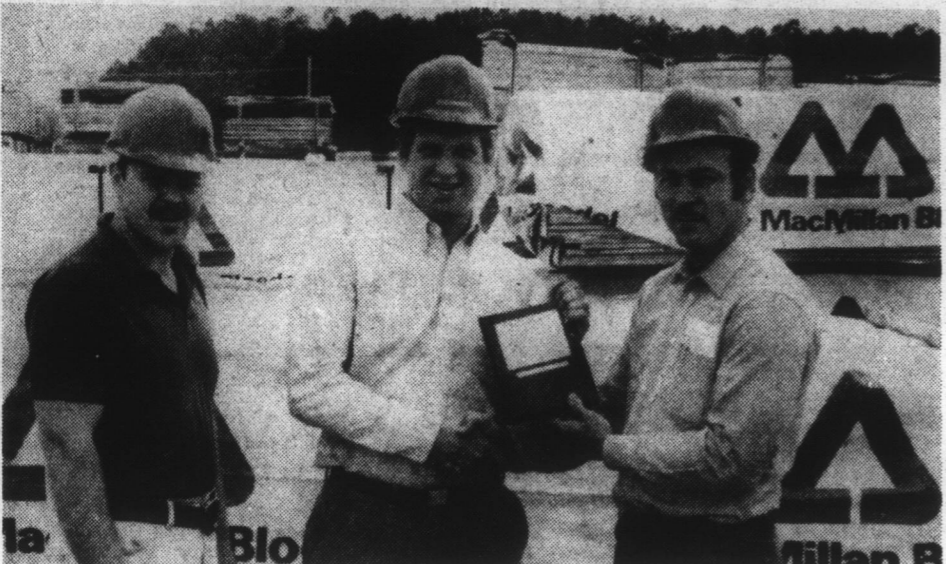
Aerobic Exercise Class

To qualify for this award the employees and management of AFP had to maintain an accident record that was at

least 50% lower than the state-wide average for sawmills over a five year period. Also during this time the company logged in a 1 1/2 year period from July 1980 to January 1982 and a 1 year period from January 1982 to

January 1983 without lost time injuries. Considering the hazards faced in the logging and lumber industry this is an impressive record of which each and every member of the AFP family can be proud.
