Beatty Criticizes

Power Plays

Jim Beatty, vice-president of the Committee on Constitutional Integrity, in a statement released came down sharply on what he called "the perpetuation of power bordering on absolute power in the North Carolina Legislature."

He referred to the possible re-election of the Speaker of the House "not just for a second term, but for a third, fourth, and possibly ongoing."

This means a small group of people might end up generally controlling the North Carolina Legislature...I believe there is a difference between power and absolute power - you can perpetuate power but perpetuating absolute power, to me, gets a little bit dangerous."

Beatty, Charlotte businessman and former legislator, is probably best known as a member of the N.C. Sports Hall of Fame and the first man in the world to break the indoor 4 minute mile. Beatty was active in the Sanford administration prior to his election as a three-term House member from Mecklenburg County.

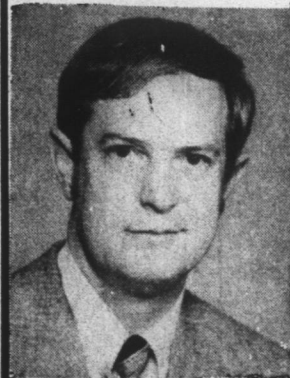
He focused his remarks on the bill currently before the General Assembly, HB 53 "Separation of Powers." This bill attempts to place the Advisory Budget Commission in

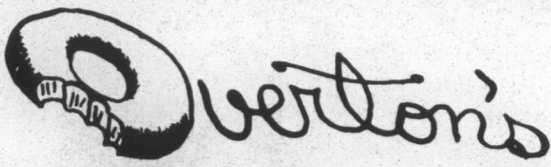
