Bond Sales Are Noted

Sales of Series EE Savings Bonds in Chowan County during the first three months of 1983 totaled \$8,638.

January-March sales of U.S. Savings Bonds in North Carolina amounted to \$12,340,591, 4.8 per cent above the same period last year. This represents 24 per cent of the state's dollar goal of \$51,400,000.

Nationally, sales rose to 1.1-billion, 28 per cent above last year's sales. Redemptions for the quarter were 33 per cent below last year.

Holdings (amount outstanding) increased by \$477-million during the quarter, bringing the year-to-date total to \$1,234-million and total holdings to \$68,814-million. Series E & EE Bonds exchanged for Series HH Bonds totaled 197 million dollars for the quarter.

"The steady increase in sales and decline in redemption shows that the market-based rate system is working as intended," said Steven R. Mead, executive director of the U.S. Savings Bonds Division.
