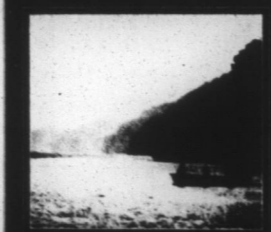

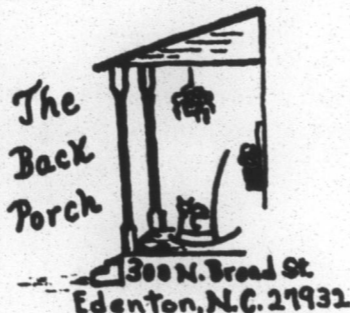
### M&M Daycare Holds Graduation

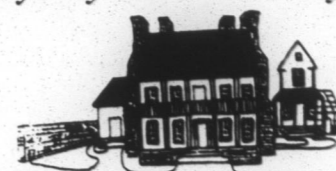
