

Adopt-A-Student

Elisabeth Von Brand, an international student at N.C. State University, will give away some of her clothes so she can have plenty of room in her suitcases to pack her North Carolina handcrafted quilt, corn shuck wreath, tobacco twine pillow, pepper jelly and corn meal for her trip home to Chile.

The handcrafts and Tar Heel specialties, given to Von Brand by the Wayne County Extension Homemakers, were just a few of the mementos and memories she will take home after participating in the "Adopt-A-Student" program following the end of the spring semester in May.

The program was sponsored by the N.C. Extension Homemakers Association and the International Student Advisor's Office at NCSU. Through the program, students from Chile, Peru, Venezuela, Mali, Malaysia and Taiwan were given the opportunity to experience life in rural North Carolina for one week.

Tailored to each student's academic interests, "Adopt-A-Student" allowed students to interact with residents of participating counties and observe agricultural practices and techniques as well as the social and cultural aspects of their host county.

In exchange for the learning experience, students shared the customs and culture of their home countries with extension homemakers, civic groups and host families.

Von Brand, a one-year Rotary scholar studying forestry genetics, said she carried a map with her all the time so she could show the many groups and people she met the exact location of her hometown Quilpie.

She said, "To speak about Chile three times a day is one thing, but to eat Wayne County home cooking three times a day is something else! I always tried everything, and it was fantastic!"

The food also was good in Buncombe County according to Samba Traore, a student in crop science from Mali, Africa. He said he enjoyed being able to observe a working American farm for the first time while visiting Buncombe County.

As a former extension agent in Mali, a country where the land is worked by hand, Traore said he was impressed with the Buncombe County communities and the effect of the N.C. Agricultural Extension Service network on the implementation of new techniques.

Over 2,000 North Carolinians were reached through last year's "Adopt-A-Student" program which involved eight NCSU students and five counties. This year, the program grew to involve 15 counties and 30 students from NCSU, East Carolina University, UNC-Charlotte, Central Piedmont Community College and Meredith College.

Julia Seibert, international chairman of the North Carolina Extension Homemakers Association, said, "My goal in creating this program is for everyone reached by the experience to realize the essential oneness of the human family."
