The vehicles will be on display at 11:00 A.M. on the Green in front of John A. Holmes High School along **Broad Street.** The celebration will begin at 1:30 P.M. from the display area and parade down Broad Street. The vehicles will make a left on Water Street and enter the water in front of the cannons. They will be required to pass around a marker in the water and back to the cannons. The awards ceremony will follow the race.

Crews are advised to consider the steepness of the area, from land to water, in front of the cannons on Water Street, in their mechanical and safety designs. The race will be from a standing start with the vehicle in a static, motionless state. Push starts are allowed, but all "pushers" must accompany the vehicle throughout the race. In case of rain, the race will still be run because you are going to get wet anyway.


