Pepper To Be Keynote Speaker

U.S. Rep. Claude Pepper (D-Fla.), most noted for his strong stands to protect older adults, will be the keynote speaker for the N.C. Democratic Party's Senior Democrats Mini-Conference to be held June 17-18 at the Raleigh Hilton on Hillsborough Street.

Pepper, 82, was recently featured on the cover of "Time" as spokesman for older adults in the nation. He and Gov. Jim Hunt will highlight the two-day conference which will focus on teaching older adults how to actively and effectively participate in political organizations.

The program will focus both on issues and strategy. Dr. Elizabeth Welch, founder of the Senior Democrats, has been praised by leaders from across the nation for her pioneer work in

active senior involvement. "I can think of no more important group of Democrats than North Carolina's older adults," said North Carolina Democratic Party Chairman Russell Walker. "With the fine leadership of Dr. Welch, I am sure this Mini-Conference will provide the kind of information that will help older adults in North Carolina have full and meaningful political voices."
