Long, who was diagnosed with diabetes 38 years ago at age 10, is suffering from kidney failure. He has been on the transplant list for a new kidney for the past two and a half years and on dialysis at home since March of this year.

Long, a mechanic, said that his illness prevents him from working much, but that he tries to work one or two days a week to help support his family.

Amy, who has worked at Vidant Women's Care in Edenton for about a dozen years as a medical assistant, said she is hopeful the surgery will give her husband's health the boost




