Irving Glover Addresses Postal Employes on 16th At Winston-Salem Meet

Reviews History of Postal Service from Early Beginning.

From the use of the dromedary in Biblical times to the swiftly flying mail plane of today, the history of the letter, as written means of communication between peoples, was traced by Assistant Postmaster General Glover in a speech today to postmasters and postal employees assemplied from all sections of North Carolina in the postal conference-convention at Winston-Salem.

Taking for 'his subject "Your Business and My Business." Mr. Glover compared the problems of the ostal service from the time of Benjamin Franklin, first Postmaster General of the United States, when the yearly receipts were nly \$25,000 to that of Postmaster General Work when the receipts have reached the high mark of \$464,000,000.
