One of the most important probon to consider will be that of the in-terchange of power between the various companies in the several state this involving not only economical and engineering but legal and ind-ustrial aspects. The possibilities of uch understanding and prepartion was vividly illustrated last summe and in years of the greaf drought of 1921, when an agreement was effected whereby the Alabama Fower Company diverted the power of the Gorges steam plant near Muscle Shoals, sending it to the Georgia Railway and Power Company, which in turn transmitted an equal amount of current to the Southern Power Company, It, in turn, transmitted the power recei-ved to the Carolina Light and Power Company for the use of its custo ers in Raleigh and neighboring sections. This operation made up a transfer of power over inter-con-proted lines of approximately one thousand miles, a larger distance the such a zervice had ever been realiz upon in this country, and prob-y in the world. Understanding ably and agreement upon this character of essential development is emphasized at the present time by the cirimstance that many states are engaged in water power legislation, some of them proposing a tax upor the export of power.

Another difficult but highly in portant question to be discussed will be that of the establishment of cen-tral steam plants to supplement hythese plants to supplement hy-dro-electric stations. Plaferably these plants would be placed near deposits and located on streams af-fording a suitable supply of water for purposes of consideration. The steam plant at the coal mine is the most practical suggestion yet brought forward to meet the impending national fuel crisis and will be from now on more and more in the public eye and receive more and more consideration from, industry and capital. In this connection, the only known site in North Carolina which fulfills the requirements is in the first stage of development by
