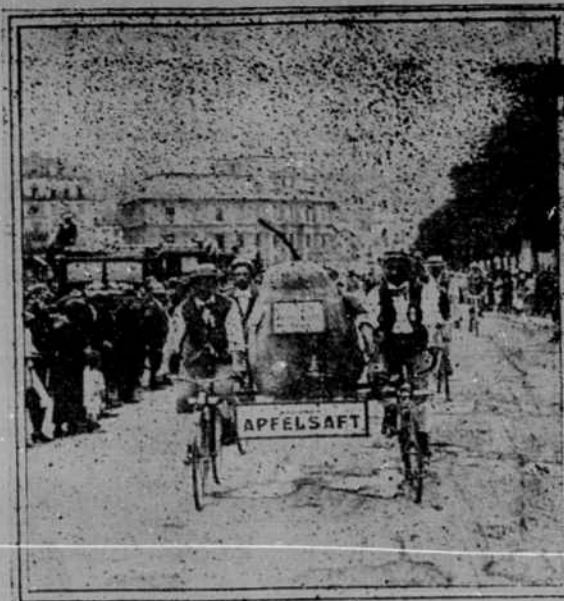

Miss Minnie Thompson and others were in town Monday on business.

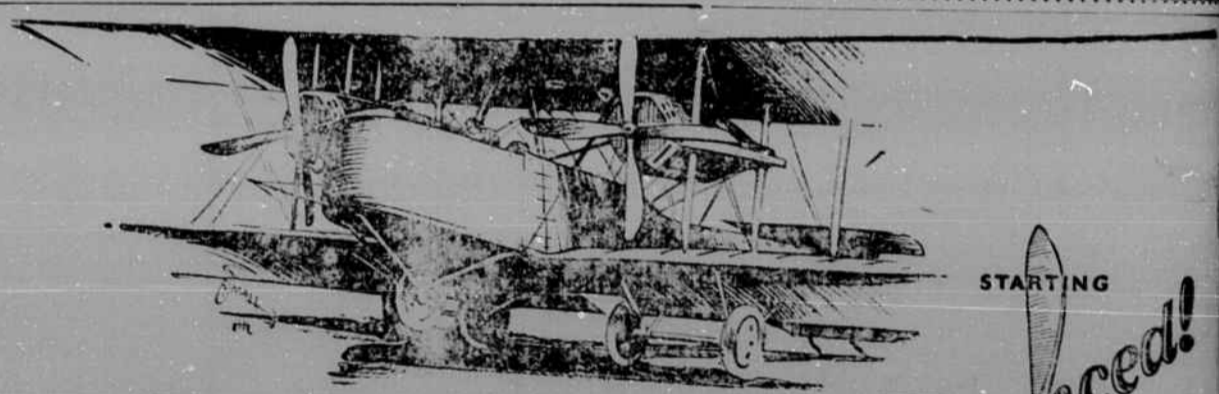
