CHEROKEE CO. BEGAN SAWING TIMBER TUESDAY

Logs From Davis Creek Brought in to Mill—Have Ten Years' Cutting

The hard work of the Cherokee Company, formerly owned by the Boone Lumber Manufacturing Co., resumed the cutting of timber Tuesday afternoon.

Much of the work has been done by the present company in getting the holdings of the company in shape for a new and economical operation.

The Cherokee Company is using about 25 men in the mill and ten on the local yards and maintains a crew of from 75 to 125 men in the woods.

The company's holdings are sufficient to keep them steadily operating for ten years, it has been reliably estimated.

POWER COMPANY WANTS TO BUILD ON HIWASSEE

Federal Power Commission Has Been Asked For Permit—Dam to Be 170 Feet High

According to announcement recently made by the Federal Power Commission of Washington, The Appalachian Power Co. has applied to the Commission for a permit to construct a 170 foot dam on the Hiwassee River about one mile above Murphy.

An official advertisement giving notice of the application to construct this plant is carried in another part of this issue of The Scout.

"In addition," says the announcement, "to develop power at the dam, the large reservoir which will be created by this high dam, will completely regulate the flow of the Hiwassee river and will make available this regulated flow through a drop of approximately 375 feet over a series of five proposed dams below Murphy.

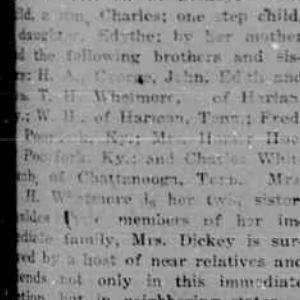
