

COUNTY ROAD COMMISSION ASKS FOR BOND ISSUE

AT a meeting of the County Road Commission on Wednesday of this week a resolution was passed favoring the issuance of \$150,000 worth of road bonds to be used on the road of the county. On Thursday the Road Commission went before the County Commissioners and asked them to make such a bond issue, and accordingly, this week notice of sale of said bonds is being published.

It is contemplated that the proceeds from this issue will be used on the roads down the Hiwassee in Shoal Creek and Hothouse Townships on the road to the Tennessee State line and on the Aquone Road in Valleytownship. This money will be used in grading but the Commission confidently expects that the State will take over one of the roads, either the one through Beaverdam or the one to the Tennessee State line the other way. This will be determined largely by the amount of road bonds the next State legislature votes.

On this the 20th day of November, 1924, the returns of the stock law held on the 7th day of April, 1924, under an order of the board heretofore made which was based upon a petition of the requisite number of qualified voters upon the question of stock law or no stock law in a certain district in Hot House Township and in the boundary hereinafter described are exhibited to the board of County Commissioners and it appears to the board that at said election a majority of those voting cast their ballot in favor of stock law there being a majority for stock law.

It is thereupon considered and ordered by the board of County Commissioners of Cherokee County that the majority of those voting in said territory have voted in favor of stock law.

It is further ordered by the said board that all that territory embracing township known as the timebred in said certain district in Hot House Township, to-wit:

Beginning on a stock law line at the John Price Gap running with the meanders of the mountain with the stock law line to the Vance Mountain at the Georgia line; thence with

the Georgia line to a point near W. C. Hyde's, the point of the mountain the divides of the waters of Hot House and Wolf Creek known as the Franklin Mountain back to the beginning at the John Price Gap.

This boundary has recently voted on and the majority voting in favor of stock law, and shall be stock law territory from and after the 1st day of November, 1924, and it shall be unlawful for any person, corporation or firm to allow any horse, mule, cattle, sheep, hogs, or other stock of any kind to run at large in the above described territory.

It is further ordered by the board that the above boundary from and after the 1st day of November, 1924, shall constitute a stock law territory.
