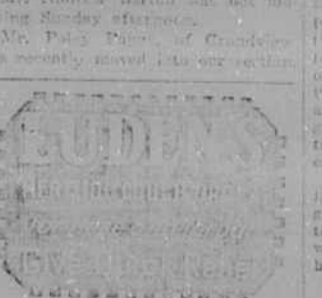
**BASKETBALL SEASON WILL OPEN HERE FRIDAY AFTERNOON**

**GOLDEN RULE DAY TO AID NEAR EAST**  
Five Million Dollars Needed for Refugees Orphans Under American Care.

**23 NAT. JOIN OBSERVANCE**  
State and County Committees Organized to insure Success of Nation-Wide Campaign.

With the cooperation of civic and religious leaders throughout the United States, the Near East Relief has inaugurated its campaign for the second observance of International Golden Rule Sunday on December 7. The aim is to raise funds to provide during the coming year for 100,000 orphan children under American care in little camps. More than five million dollars is the minimum needed. The national Golden Rule committee was organized several months ago, under the chairmanship of Cleveland H. DeLoach, the well-known philanthropist. An executive council is under the chairmanship of John H. Fulen, formerly commissioner of Education of New York State and now president of a New York college. State and county committees are being organized throughout the United States to increase the number of Golden Rule camps.
