Notice is hereby given that W. S. Whiting of Shall Mills, N. C. has

made an offer of \$25,000.00 for the lumber at Shall Mills, N. C., said offer being conditioned upon the payment by Cherokee Company of

outstanding wage claims in the amount of \$29,984.65, and further conditioned upon the execution of a lease to the said Whiting of the Shall Mills Plant of Cherokee Company for the period of three months, with an option to the lessee to renew the said lease for the further period of four months,

the said lessee proposing to pay a rental of \$500.00 per month for the first three months, or until 1,800,000 feet of lumber is cut, and thereafter \$1.00 for every thousand feet of lumber cut with a minimum rental of \$8800.00 per month. The said

lease further proposes to purchase all of the felled and standing timber tributary to the mill, approximately 800,000 feet for \$6.00 per thousand feet less scale. The said lease to be terminated by the Court at any time in its discretion for good cause.
