Dear Mr. Mayor:

Your very interesting telegram of the 24th was duly received to which I replied by wire the same day. We are undertaking a relationship between the Town of Murphy and the Carolina-Tennessee Power Company that I hope and expect will give satisfaction to all concerned.

Will you kindly write me when you will be ready to make formal transfer on behalf of the Town of Murphy to the Carolina-Tennessee Power Company of the electric property of the town.

If I am not able to come myself to take delivery I will appoint some one else to act in my stead.

It will be the policy of the Carolina-Tennessee Power Company to retain in its employ the present employees of the town now engaged in the work of operating the electric property so long as they give conscientious loyal and efficient service. This kind of service I feel sure all of them intend to give.

If you have not already completed the inventory will you not have it ready by the time you are ready to make delivery of the property; and will you not have the meters read carefully at the time of the transfer so that you may hand to the company as a part of the transfer a list of such meter readings certified as correct by Mr. Elkins or such other person as you may nominate.
