CLAY COUNTY FAST BECOMING DAIRY COUNTY

On the 20th of March, Clay County farmers purchased from Georgia twenty-eight head of high producing Jersey cows. Most of them were registered and having creditable records. W. R. Anderson, County Agent, reports that several other farmers purchased cows individually which makes the number larger.

In a very short while the farmers of Clay County are going after another ear of Jersey. Sufficient registered Jersey Sires were placed in the county last year to serve the entire dairy interest of the county. The Clay County dairymen have established a cream station at Hayesville, where all their cream is tested and paid for when delivered. \$59. worth of cream is going out each week. A year ago no cream went out at all from Clay County. With the importation of cattle, as is going in Clay, the breeding at home; the income of Clay County is soon to be increased enormously by the dairy cow.

The Clay County farmers are producing more of the feed at home to produce this cream with. They are lining their lands, growing more legumes and building up the soil to a high state of fertility. With the dairy cow comes the hog and hen. Three Durocs from the sale at the W. N. C. Exposition, the best in the sale, went to Clay County, recently these have been purchased in Buncombe County for Clay County farmers.

Baby chicks are also going into Clay County to make poultry raising another feature of the increase profit from the farm.

County Agent Anderson is just as interested in all of Clay County's progress as if it was his farm. On the 16th of March a group of Clay County's most progressive men met and organized themselves in order that they might more actively prosecute this program of progress.
