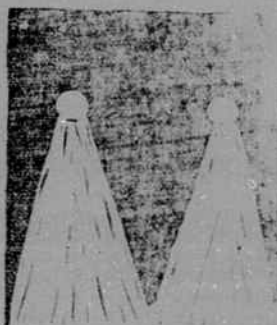

Please print the following notice for four consecutive weeks as required by law:

To all persons, corporations, railway companies, electrical power companies, and lumber companies, or private individuals, or United States claiming title or ownership to 22,800 acres of land entered in the year 1855 by my father, James Taylor, now deceased as per his official will as recorded in Murphy, Cherokee County, North Carolina and filed with the Hon. Secretary of the Interior, the records of deeds of Cherokee County, Graham County and Clay County as per affidavit of my father James Taylor, now deceased, which is a public record, which is due notice to all parties in possession or claiming the title to 22,800 acres of land claimed and owned by my father, James Taylor, now deceased, a Cherokee Indian by blood who died at Claremore Indian Territory, now Oklahoma, January 14th, 1907. C. revised statute in the United States Court of the Western district of North Carolina at Asheville, N. C. for possession and all improvements thereunto now erected on the above 22,800 acres of land as granted to my father, James Taylor, by the State of North Carolina in 1855 which claim of the United States Government was pending in the United States Court of claim at the death of my father, James Taylor, deceased.
