

List Books Powelson Donation Announced

The Trustees of the Carnegie Library announced last week the receipt of a number of volumes from Mr. W. V. N. Powelson of New York City as a gift to the public library.

The volumes donated by Mr. Powelson will be a source of enjoyment to the community for many years to come and his generosity will be remembered and appreciated by each successive reader of any of them.

The library has no source of income, therefore, making it impossible to purchase books. It is dependent upon gifts of money or books by individuals, associations and clubs for all volumes added to its shelves.

Mr. Powelson will be interviewed here as the President of the Carolina-Tennessee Power Company, which company recently purchased the hydro-electric plant of the Town. His company, it is understood, also largely owns the riparian rights on the Hiwassee river below Murphy and has underway plans for the development of the river. He is known by many Murphy citizens. His gift of books is only another evidence of his interest in this section.

County Court in Session Here Monday

The general County Court of Cherokee County held its regular session here on Monday of this week. Judge W. M. Axby is the presiding judge and attorney F. O. Christofel is solicitor.

Among the more important cases tried was the State against Ed Barnett of the Peachtree and Vengeance Creek sections who was charged with setting fire to the woods and fields. It is alleged that Barnett set fire to the woods and fields which burned over several hundred acres, causing damage and loss of something like ten to twenty thousand dollars.

Barnett was found guilty and sentenced to four months on the road. "The evidence in this case was mostly circumstantial," said Solicitor Christofel the other day, "but the chain of evidence worked up was perfect in every detail and we proved beyond a reasonable doubt that the defendant was guilty."

The record to be the first conviction for the alleged act of putting out fire in the county, especially in the woods and fields. Barnett, upon conviction, immediately gave notice of appeal.
