Company, established by the two companies in conformity with the decision of the Interstate Commerce Commission, became effective on Wednesday, March 26th.

Shippers desiring to give the Southeastern its long haul on business moving through Washington, Richmond, Cincinnati, Louisville, Cairo, Jacksonville, Savannah, Memphis, or Montgomery can now do so by specifying any one of the million and a half routes included in the Southeastern's Routing Guide which has been filed with the Interstate Commerce Commission and placed at the disposal of shippers and receivers of express traffic.

The Routing Guide contains lists of stations in Florida, New England, New York, New Jersey, Pennsylvania, Delaware, Maryland, District of Columbia, Ohio, Michigan, Indiana, Illinois, Wisconsin, Minnesota, Iowa, Missouri, Nebraska, and Arkansas from which the shipper may route his business, using the Southeastern through the designated gateway.

In announcing the opening of the new through routes, president J. E. Smaggs of the Southeastern, states that they had been worked out by the two companies in an effort to give shippers the benefit of its most expeditious routes for moving their express traffic.

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF TWENTY THOUSAND DOLLARS, SIX PER CENT, STREET IMPROVEMENT BONDS OF THE TOWN OF MURPHY, NORTH CAROLINA. Section 1. That for the purpose of providing funds with which to improve the streets of the Town of Murphy by adding not less than six feet to the width of the concrete pavement to laid on the State Highway No. 10 from the Louisville & Nashville Railroad Company's depot to the corporate limits of the Town at its North Eastern Boundary there shall be issued and sold negotiable coupon bonds of the Town of Murphy to the amount of Twenty Thousand Dollars, the said bonds to bear interest at the rate of six per cent, payable semiannually, and to mature serially in the maximum period of twenty years, one thousand dollars of said bonds to mature each year, beginning three years after the date of issuance, for sixteen years, and two thousand dollars yearly thereafter until the entire amount of said bonds shall have been paid, and said bonds shall bear such date and be issued in such form as the governing body of the town of Murphy may, by resolution, determine. Section 2. That a tax sufficient to pay the principal and interest of the said bonds shall be annually levied and collected. Section 3. That a statement of the debt of the said municipality has been filed with the Clerk of the municipality and is open for public inspection. Section 4. That the probable period of usefulness of the improvements for which said bonds are to be issued is twenty years. Section 5.
