NOTICE OF STOCK LAW ELECTION

At the regular meeting of the Board of County Commissioners of Cherokee County, North Carolina, on the 7th day of September, 1925, a petition was presented to the said Board and signed by more than one fifth of the qualified voters of said boundary in Murphy township, Cherokee County, North Carolina, hereinafter set out asking that an election be called by said board to vote stock law election or against stock law.

It is ordered by the board of County Commissioners of Cherokee County, North Carolina, in regular session on the 1st Monday in September 1925, that an election be held under the rules and regulations of the general election laws of the state of North Carolina at the grand stall in the ball park at Murphy, N. C., in said boundary hereinafter set out on the 24th day of October, 1925, to vote for stock law or against stock law, in the following territory, viz:

Beginning on Valley River at the place where the township line between Murphy and Valletown Township crosses same, and on the west side thereof and running down said river to its mouth at Hiwassee River; thence down Hiwassee River to the line of the stock law district known as the Bates Creek Stock Law District; thence with the line of said stock law district to the top of the dividing mountain between Owl Creek and Valley River; hence with the top of said divide in a northerly direction to Valletown Township line; thence with the Valletown Township line to the place of beginning on Valley River.

And for the purpose of said election it is ordered that a new registration be held of the qualified voters of said boundary set out above.

It is further ordered by the Board of County Commissioners that A. H. Brown be appointed Registrar of said election and that J. M. Barnett and T. J. Mauney be appointed as Judges of said election, and for the said A. H. Brown as Registrar in said voting precinct to keep book open at his place or residence beginning Saturday, September 19th, 1925, and to keep same open each Saturday for four successive weeks; and that John Keener be appointed as Registrar for Tomotla precinct, and Oliver Stiles and J. T. Hayes be appointed as judges for said election for Tomotla voting precinct, and for the said registrar to open his books at his place of business at Tomotla on Saturday September 19th, 1925, and to keep them open each Saturday for four successive weeks; and on

Saturday, October 17th, to keep books open for challenge. Those in favor of Stock law shall vote a prin-law shall vote on a written or printed ticket against stock law.

It is further ordered that said election be conducted and held in the same manner and way as the general election and that due returns be made to this board.

State vs. Walter Bryson.

PROCLAMATION
Whereas, an affidavit having been filed with the undersigned, Justices of the Peace of Cherokee County, North Carolina, giving information that a felony has been committed by Walter Bryson, in that he is charged with willfully, unlawfully and feloniously, and of his malice aforethought having killed and murdered one "Doc" Bryson, and the said Walter Bryson flees from Justice, conceals himself, and evades arrest and service of the issued process of the law.

Wherefore, the undersigned, Justices of the Peace of Cherokee County, issues this their proclamation against the said Walter Bryson, requiring him, the said Walter Bryson, forthwith to surrender himself, and hereby empowers and requires the Sheriff of Cherokee County, North Carolina, to take such power with him as he shall think fit and necessary for the going in search and pursuit of, and effectually apprehending the said Walter Bryson.

And the said Walter Bryson is hereby warned that if he, the said Walter Bryson, continues to stay out, lurk and conceal himself, and does not immediately surrender himself, then any citizen of the County may capture arrest and bring him to Justice, and in case of flight or resistance by him, the said Walter Bryson after being called upon and warned to surrender, may slay him without accusation or impeachment of any crime.

It is hereby directed that this proclamation shall be published at the door of the court House at Murphy, Cherokee County, and also that it be published once a week for four weeks in the Cherokee Scout, a newspaper published in said County.

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF TWENTY THOUSAND DOLLARS, SIX PER CENT, STREET IMPROVEMENT BONDS OF THE TOWN OF MURPHY, NORTH CAROLINA

Be it ordained by the Board of Commissioners of the Town of Murphy, North Carolina.

Section 1. That for the purpose of providing funds to improve the streets of the Town of Murphy by laying penetration macadam pavement upon Peachtree Street, Tennessee Street, Hiwassee Street, Valley River Avenue, Walnut Street Terrace Avenue and Grant Street in said town there shall be issued and sold negotiable coupon bonds of the Town of Murphy, North Carolina, to the amount of Twenty thousand Dollars, said bonds to bear interest at the rate of six per cent, payable semi-annually, and to mature serially in the maximum period of ten years, two thousand dollars of said bonds to mature each year, beginning three years after date of issuance, for six years, 1928 to 1933 both inclusive, and four thousand

dollars in each of the years 1934 and 1935, and said bonds shall bear such date and be issued in such form as the governing body of the Town of Murphy may, by resolution determine.

Section 2. That a tax sufficient to pay the principal and interest of said bonds shall be annually levied and collected.

Section 3. That a statement of the debts of said municipality has been filed which the Clerk of the said municipality and is open for public inspection.

Section 4. That the probable period of usefulness of said improvement for which said bonds are to be issued is forty years.

Section 5. That this ordinance shall take effect thirty days after its first publication, unless in the meantime a petition for its submission to the voters is filed under the provisions of law, and in that event it shall take effect when approved by the voters of the municipality at an election as is provided by law.

The foregoing ordinance was passed on the 12th day of October, 1925, and was first published on the 16th day of October, 1925.

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF FORTY THOUSAND DOLLARS WATER BONDS OF THE TOWN OF MURPHY, NORTH CAROLINA

Be it ordained by the Board of Commissioners of the Town of Murphy, North Carolina.

Section 1. That for the purpose of providing funds to install a pumping and filtering plant and extend the water mains to supply water for the use of the inhabitants of the Town of Murphy, North Carolina, there shall be issued and sold negotiable coupon bonds of the Town of Murphy, North Carolina, to the amount of Forty thousand Dollars, said bonds to bear interest at the rate of six per cent, payable semi-annually, and to mature serially in the maximum period of forty years, one thousand dollars of said bonds to mature each year, beginning three years after date of issuance, for thirty-six years 1928 to 1963, both inclusive, and two thousand dollars in each of the years 1964 and 1965, and said bonds shall bear such date and be issued in such form as the governing body of the Town of Murphy may, by resolution determine.

Section 2. That a tax sufficient to pay the principal and interest of said bonds shall be annually levied and collected.

Section 3. That a statement of the debts of said municipality has been filed which the Clerk of the said municipality and is open for public inspection.

Section 4. That the probable period of usefulness of said improvement for which said bonds are to be issued is forty years.

Section 5. That this ordinance shall take effect thirty days after its first publication, unless in the meantime a petition for its submission to the voters is filed under the provisions of law, and in that event it shall take effect when approved by the voters of the municipality at an election as is provided by law.
