Selecting a Route
To Tennessee

In another column of this issue is
carried the letter of Mr. J. T. Dockery
relative to the selection of a
route to Tennessee which route is
to be taken over and maintained by
the state as a part of the state sys-
tem of highways. Mr. Dockery's
suggestion is good. It has been
nearly two years since the Highway
Commission was delegated the au-
thority to make the selection, and
no route has yet been selected.

Mr. Stikeleather, in behalf of the
State Highway Commission, has stated
that he would like to have the
sentiment of the people of Cherokee
County, and this plan would cer-
tainly give them some light as to
the wishes of a majority of the peo-
ple.

It has been suggested that the
voting start on Monday, March 22,
1926 and close Tuesday, April 6, at
midnight, and that the counting be
done Wednesday, April 7. However,
whether this plan meets the approval
of the people. The Scout is not in
position to say, and therefore, since
it has been asked to act as a third
party in judging, it would like to
have an expression from the peo-
ple as to their approval or disapproval
of the plan.

It is admitted that the plan is a
good one for determining the wishes
of the people, and The Scout believes
it only fair to give them an oppor-
tunity to express their opinions on the
matter. Therefore it is The Scout's
suggestion that the actual voting be
delayed for a week in order that this
expression might be carried in these
columns next week.

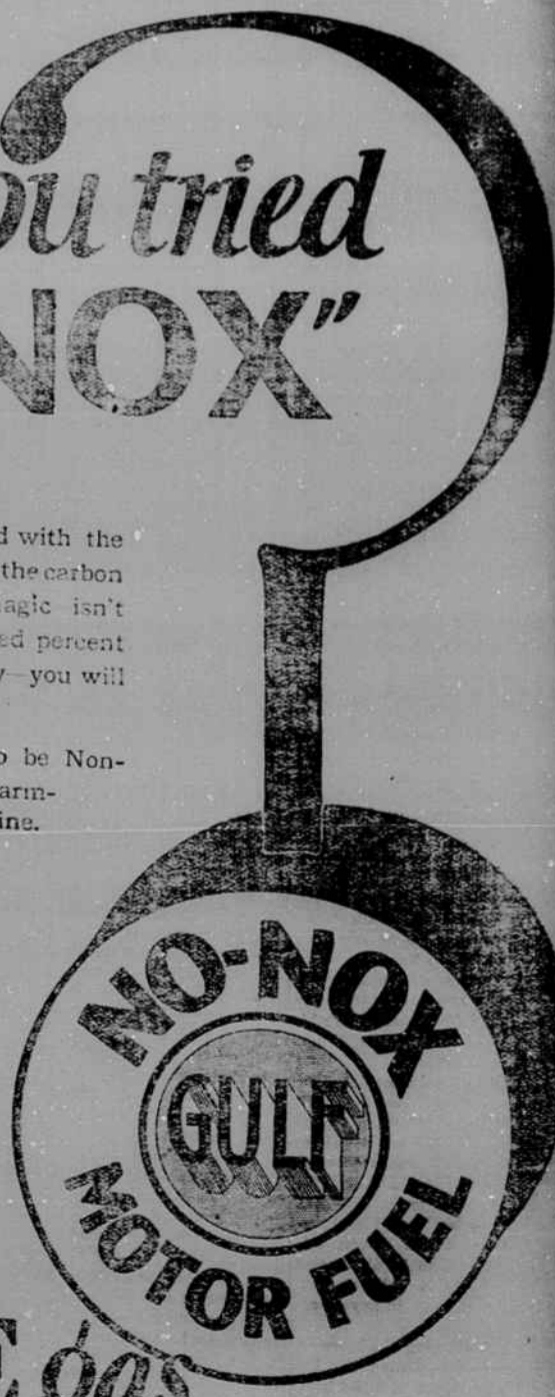
