NORTH CAROLINA, CHEROKEE COUNTY.

Bids will be received by T. W. Axley, Chairman County Board of Commissioners of Cherokee County, Murphy, North Carolina, until Thursday, April 15th, 1926 at 12 o'clock noon for the erection of a court house for the said county, to be two stories in height, to contain offices for all necessary county officials, court room, etc. To be built of brick, marble, stone, hollow tile, the floors, ceiling and roof, slabs, etc. to be of reinforced concrete, dome and lantern to be of steel construction. Building will be heated from the present jail building by low pressure steam heat. The construction of said building is to begin within thirty days after awarding the contract and to be completed by December 1st, 1926.

Payments for work and material to be made from time to time on estimates furnished from the contractor and approved by the architect, averaging 85 per cent of the work done and material on the ground. Balance of 15 per cent to be paid when the building is fully complete and accepted by the architect and Board of County Commissioners.

Each bidder to deposit with his bid a certified check for \$1,000.00 payable to T. W. \$600,000 MARK PASSED IN SMOKY PARK CAMPAIGN

Amount Raised in Western North Carolina and Eastern Tennessee

North Carolina and Tennessee in their effort to raise a minimum of one million dollars for the purchase of the Great Smokey Mountains National Park lands have passed the \$600,000 mark. With North Carolina reporting a total of \$40,000 in pledges, and with Tennessee's contributions totaling \$263,213, the grand total to date of the two states' efforts is \$603,213.

Virtually every dollar of this total has been pledged by the people of Eastern Tennessee and Western North Carolina. Of the North Carolina total all but approximately \$14,000 has come from the park proponents of the western counties.

Asheville and Buncombe County have made largest total, having pledged a proximately \$207,000. The other Western North Carolina Counties and their reported pledged follows: Swain, \$31,000; Haywood, \$30,000; Rutherford, \$5,000; Yancey, \$2,895; Clay, \$1,001; Mitchell, \$1,000; Henderson, \$6,000; Madison, \$2,000; Transylvania, \$8,000; Jackson, \$13,635; Cherokee, \$12,000; Caldwell, \$1,000; Macon, \$8,100; Alexander, \$100. The towns and cities of the piedmont section have raised approximately \$14,000 to date.

The total for the towns and cities of Eastern Tennessee are reported as follows: Knoxville, \$220,000; Maryville, \$9,000; Greeneville, \$2,800; Jonesboro, \$7,000; Sevierville, \$1,600; Rogersville, \$2,000; Cleveland, \$1,125; Report, \$4,688; Morristown, \$1,500; Sweetwater, \$2,300; Athens, \$2,000; Johnson City, \$13,500; Copperhill \$500, and Huntsville, \$500. The campaign is to close on April 1. If at that time the million dollars is not pledged, it is unlikely that the matter will be taken up at this session of Congress, and possibly the park may be lost to the people of the two states entirely.

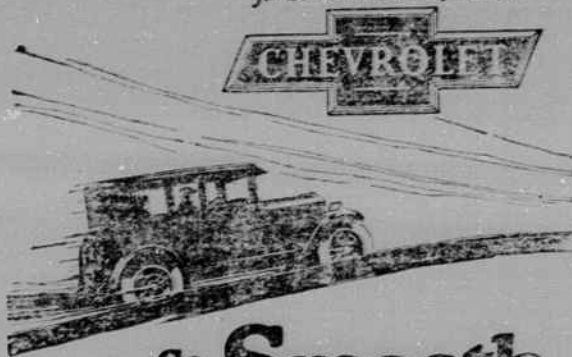
