AGRICULTURAL PICTURES BEING SHOWN IN COUNTY

Large Crowds Assembled At Different Places Enjoy Unique and Instructive Movies

County Agent R. W. Gray is this week showing a number of agricultural moving pictures in different sections of the county. The pictures are of subjects that interest every farmer and farm woman, and are being well received over the county.

Monday night they were shown at Martins Creek; Tuesday night they were shown at Grandview; Wednesday night at Salt; Thursday night at Calhoun; and they will be shown Friday night at Peachtree. At every place where they have been shown this week, crowds ranging from four to five hundred people have assembled to see them.

The pictures are all of an educational value, dealing with farm subjects. There are six reels in all, and due to the late hour at which the show is invariably of necessity begun, on most occasions only five are shown.

One reel is a comic cartoon, dealing with better dairy farming, purebred cattle, and the story of the banishment of the scrub sire.

Another reel deals with forestry and improved methods of forest work and preservation. Another, and perhaps the best of the six, shows the application of modern farm machinery, household conveniences and labor-saving devices, their adaptability to ordinary farm life, etc.

Another reel depicts the horse, showing that although there are many ways and means of swifter travel the horse is an indispensable farm animal. The picture shows the different gaits of the horse, hurdling, etc., in such detail, and the grace with which they are accomplished that the interest of all lovers of horses is keen and at high pitch during the entire reel. Another reel shows apples and other crops, such as carrots, celery, cabbage, etc. Statistics are given to show that the United States now grows more apples than any other country in the world; more than thirty-six million plants of celery are grown yearly, mostly in the sandy lands of Michigan, New York and Ohio. It also shows the different methods of gathering, grading, shipping, preserving, etc.

These pictures are furnished by the U. S. Department of Agriculture as a part of the educational program being fostered for the benefit of the farmers throughout the country. Each reel carries a point which is left pictured in the mind of every person seeing it in a more emphatic and conclusive manner than forty lawyers could portray with the words of Shakespeare.

Mr. Gray is well pleased with the reception the people of the county are giving the pictures, the many favorable comments on the lessons they teach.
