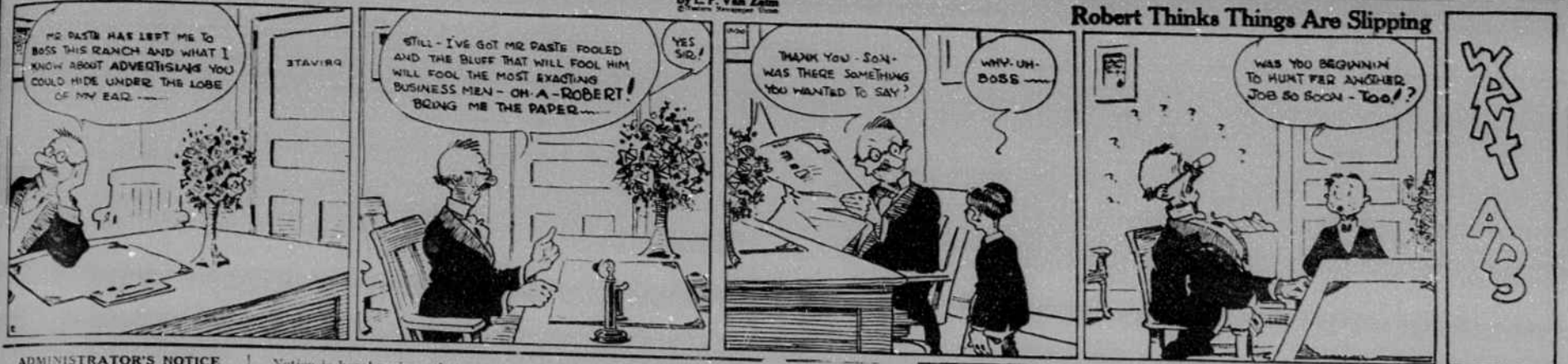

At a regular meeting of the Board of County Commissioners of Cherokee County on the 1st Monday in June, it being the 7th day of June 1926, a petition was presented to the Board of Commissioners by the Board of Education of legal petitioners of the special school district of Unaka, N. C., (it being District No. 1.) asking that the Board of Commissioners call an election to determine whether or not the special school tax in Unaka will be abolished or continued.

It is ordered by the Board of County Commissioners that an election be held in Unaka Special School District under the Rules and regulations of the General Election Laws of the State of North Carolina to determine the will of the people of said School District No. 1.
