Western North Carolina Orchard Study Tour

On Wednesday of last week a group of fruit growers of Clay County toured north Georgia studying the production of fruit, the tour was made through Neels Gap, down to Cleveland and Cornelia, there the real study began.

The first orchard visited was Mr. Veeder's, he is a peach grower perhaps one of the best authorities on peach production and marketing. We found there a gentleman, highly educated and very courteous and gave us some of the very best information that could be had. First he discussed with us the present condition of the peach grower, for the last four years the dry season had made it possible for any one to grow peaches, whether they gave them the modern culture method or not. This condition has produced a large quantity of inferior peaches, being very detrimental to the peach industry. Next Mr. Veeder conducted a tour into his orchard and explained its fertilizer demonstrations which showed the following; unfertilized trees weak and dying, nitrogen fertilized trees very green and excellent growth, nitrogen and acid as same as nitrogen alone, nitrogen and potash good growth and fine production with leaves shedding properly, nitrogen, phosphate and potash are same as nitrogen and potash, in other words nitrogen and potash is the desired fertilizer.

We visited next the Baldwin packing house and then to Mr. Black's orchard. At Mr. Black's orchard we found seven thousand trees the fruit was not so fine, it was small, off colored. Next we visited Mr. State's orchard a smaller orchard. This is the best kept orchard we visited in North Georgia, the fruit was larger and better color.

The night was spent in Clarkesville. Thursday morning we toured through Tallulah Falls section observing orchards and from there across to Hiawassee where we got in a real apple country, we ate dinner in Hiawassee
