## NOTICE!

All persons subject to taxation are required to furnish a list of their real and personal property to the List Taker of the township in which they reside, or the township in which the property is located, during the month or May; and at the same time all farmers are required to furmish an account of the number of acres in their farm, and the number of acres cultivated in the various crops for the current year, etc., etc.

The law provides that non-residents women, and invalids may list their taxes by an agent, all others must furnish their lists and verify same. It is just as important that all real estate be listed as that the personal property should be listed.

A failure to list your taxes is a misdemeanor, and also renders the delinquent subject to an additional tax on the property not listed.

For the purpose of receiving your tax lists for the year 1927, the undersigned List Taker for Murphy Township will be at the following places on dates indicated. Come and list your taxes at one of these places and thus expedite the business, and also save expenses to the public and extra cost to you.


