J. W. Witherspoon introduced the following ordinance, which was read at length:

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE TOWN OF MURPHY TO BORROW \$25,000.00 FOR SEWER PUR- POSES.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Commissioners of the Town of Murphy, North Carolina, as follows:

Section 1. Pursuant to the Municipal Finance Act, as amended, Bonds of the Town of Murphy, North Carolina, are hereby authorized to be issued in an aggregate principal amount not exceeding \$25,000.00 for the purposes hereinafter described.

Section 2. The proceeds of said bonds shall be applied solely to the construction or extending of sewer lines, tanks, filter-presses, pumps, dams, lands for disposal of sewage, necessary ditching, laying of pipes, etc. and material deemed necessary for the completion or extension of a sewerage system for the Town of Murphy, North Carolina, and to provide therefor same.

Section 3. A tax sufficient to pay the principal and interest of said bonds shall be levied and collected.

Section 4. A statement of the debt of the town has been filed with the Town Clerk, open for public inspection.

Section 5. This ordinance shall take effect thirty days after its first publication, unless in the meantime a petition for its repeal is filed under the Municipal Finance Act, as amended, in which event it shall take effect when approved by the voters of the town at an election, as provided in said Act.

The foregoing ordinance was passed on the 10th day of June, 1928, and were first published on the 23rd day of August, 1928.

Any action or proceedings questioning the validity of said ordinance must be commenced within thirty days after their first publication.

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE TOWN OF MURPHY TO BORROW \$10,000.00 FOR WATER PUR- POSES.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Commissioners of the Town of Murphy, North Carolina, as follows:

Section 1. Pursuant to the Municipal Finance Act, as amended, Bonds of the Town of Murphy, North Carolina, are hereby authorized to be issued in an aggregate principal amount not exceeding \$10,000.00 for the purposes hereinafter described.

Section 2. The proceeds of said bonds shall be applied solely to the construction or extending of water lines, tanks, filter-presses, pumps, dams, lands for disposal of sewage, necessary ditching, laying of pipes, etc. and material deemed necessary for the completion or extension of a water supply system for the Town of Murphy, North Carolina, and to provide therefor same.

Section 3. A tax sufficient to pay the principal and interest of said bonds shall be levied and collected.

Section 4. A statement of the debt of the town has been filed with the Town Clerk, open for public inspection.

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE TOWN OF MURPHY TO BORROW \$10,000.00 FOR STREET IMPROVEMENT PURPOSES.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Commissioners of the Town of Murphy, North Carolina, as follows:

Section 1. Pursuant to the Municipal Finance Act, as amended, Bonds of the Town of Murphy, North Carolina, are hereby authorized to be issued in an aggregate principal amount not exceeding \$10,000.00 for the purposes hereinafter described.

Section 2. The proceeds of said bonds shall be applied solely to the construction or extending within the incorporate limits of the Town of Murphy, of sand and gravel sidewalks, streets, highways, whether including or not including contemporaneous curbing of sidewalks, curbs, gutters or drains, and other including or not including the such surfaces.

Section 3. A tax sufficient to pay the principal and interest of said bonds shall be levied and collected.

Section 4. A statement of the debt of the town has been filed with the Town Clerk, open for public inspection.

Section 5. This ordinance shall take effect thirty days after its first publication, unless in the meantime a petition for its submission to the voters is filed under the Municipal Finance Act, as amended, in which event it shall take effect when approved by the voters of the town at an election, as provided in said Act.

The foregoing ordinance was passed on the 10th day of June, 1928, and were first published on the 23rd day of August, 1928.

Any action or proceedings questioning the validity of said ordinance must be commenced within thirty days after their first publication.

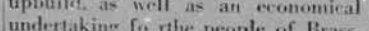
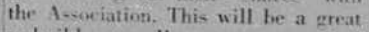

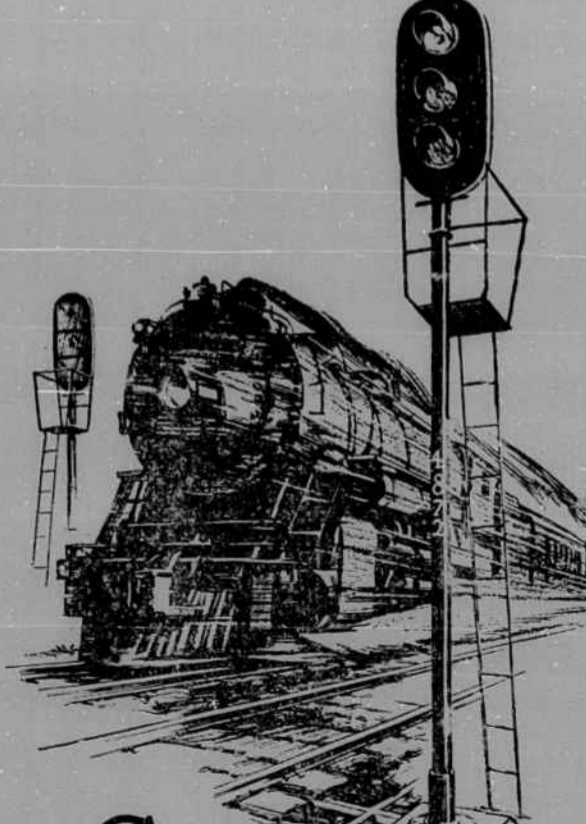
