Fair Catalogs Being Distributed This Week

The catalogs or premium lists of the Cherokee County Fair are being distributed this week by County Agent R. W. Gray and officers of the association. The catalog this year is the same as the one used last year. When the association found they had too many printed last year, and there was a leftover of some 875 copies, they decided to make only a few minor changes and use these left over from last year.

The dates of the fair this year come on Wednesday, Thursday, Friday and Saturday, October 3, 4, 5, and 6, which is a week earlier than the fair has been held in years gone by. This change was made in accordance with the expressed wishes of many of the people of the county that they believed better weather would be had during fair week. These dates are the same dates that the Indian Fair will be held at Cherokee, but it is thought that no conflict or falling off of attendance and gate receipts would be felt by either organization.

The fair this year is expected to be the biggest one ever held in the county, as the crops this year, although suffering from continuous rains, are unusually good, and it is thought that the setting the date up a week earlier will assure pretty weather and be an inducement for more and larger exhibits.
