Fined For Letting Campfire Burn Forest Dr. S. M. Snelson of Toocoo, Ga., was found guilty in Federal Court at Gainsville, Ga., on July 14, of leaving a camp fire unattended on National Forest land. Forest officers produced evidence tending to show that Dr. Snelson's camp fire had escaped to the neighboring woods and burned approximately 40 acres of government land. He was fined \$70.00.

In imposing the fine, Judge Underwood, of the Northern Judicial District of Georgia, delivered a severe indictment of the carelessness which has produced so many of Georgia's disastrous fires during the past eighteen months. He said that the South's heritage of forest resources could not be valued so lightly if we are to continue to benefit from them.
