Mr. Lee Horton made a business trip to Ducktown, Tenn., one day last week.

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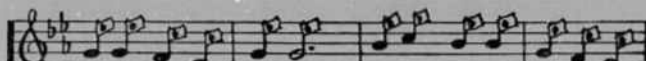
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
