

Hold Two On Charge Attempt To Drown Man

Charged with attempted murder and highway robbery, Burton Brown of Isabella, and Bill Dean of Copperhill, waived hearing Wednesday, before Justice of the Peace W. A. Travena, and are being held in Polk county jail, in default of \$6,000 bonds each, \$3,000 in each case.

Hoke Bonner, Atlanta salesman, identified the two as the boys who held him up near Parksville Saturday night, after he had given them a ride at Conasauga, and bound and gagged him. Bonner stated that the two robbed him of \$17 and his watch, then started the car downgrade into Parksville lake and jumped out.

As the automobile rolled into the water, Bonner rolled or jumped from the machine and was able to drag himself to shore.

The Atlantian, who said he lived on Route 1, Box 365, was high in his praise of Sheriff Biggs and his deputies. Sheriff Biggs offered \$25 reward for the capture of the robbers.

Chief of Police Jim Hawkins of McCaysville, captured the two youths in John Grizzle's store and turned them over to Deputy Sheriffs George and Frank Crawford at the state line. The prisoners said they were willing to cross the state line.

Bonner remained in Benton while officers of Tennessee, Georgia and North Carolina searched for the two. He said he was bruised and had "pains in my chest" from his experience, but returned to Atlanta after the hearing.

Neither of the suspects would talk, although officers said they admitted having seen Bonner and his automobile before.

Brown and Dean are both under 20. They will be tried in the November term of court.
