## World War Vet Dies Suddenly In Office Here

Funeral services for Mr. Harry Oliver Shanks, 44, of Vests, were held at the Union Baptist church Sunday, July 26, at 2:30 P. M. with the Rev. Fred Styles assisted by the Rev. Elish Beaver and the Rev. Ben Reece officiating. Interment was in the church cemetery. W. D. Townson was in charge of funeral arrangements.

Mr. Shanks, a world war veteran, died suddenly of a heart attack in the office of Dr. N. B. Adams.
