Lunch Rooms Begun In Five County Schools

Lunch rooms were opened up in five schools in Cherokee county this week.

Mrs. Walter Witt, of Peachtree, has been made superintendent of the work which is being financed largely through WPA funds.

She said lunch rooms would be opened in 16 schools in the county as soon as arrangements for opening were completed.

The rooms, she said, are being operated primarily for the benefit of underweight children, although all students will be served in them.

Supervisors in each school are being hired by the WPA and the meals are financed by the produce the students bring in in exchange for food.

"This is one means of showing that correct foods can be grown at home for proper nourishment of children", Mrs. Witt said. "All the children in the county schools will be provided for, but we especially want to properly feed the underweight children."
