Mrs. M. D. Coker, of Brasstown, visited Mrs. Tally Ledford and Mrs. J. S. Chastain Saturday of last week.

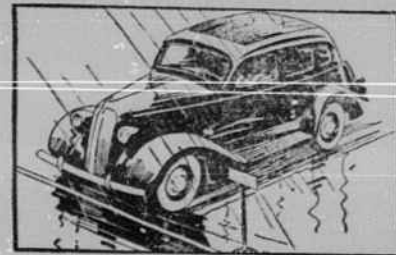

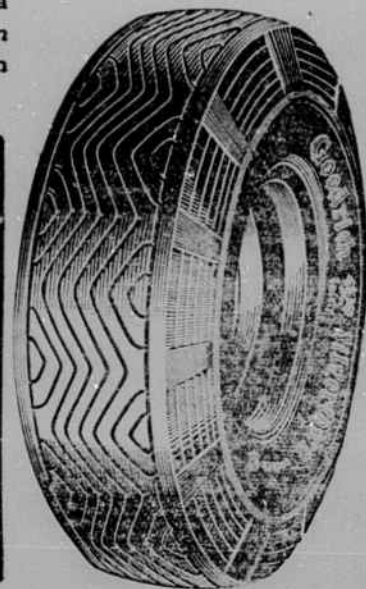
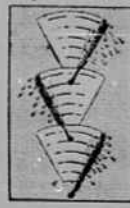
