The Regional Forester, U. S. Forest Service, under authority vested in him by an Act of Congress of February 1, 1905 (33 Stat. 628), amendatory of the Act of Congress of June 4, 1897 (30 Stat. 11), has authorized the Supervisor of the Cherokee National Forest to close the following roads or trails located on National Forest lands to vehicular traffic from January 1 to December

31 of each year for the purpose of protecting the development and operation of game management areas or for prevention of excessive damage to the roads.

In Polk County, Tennessee, for game management purposes:
Big Creek Truck Trail between Sheeds-Sylco Truck Trail and Tumbling Creek Truck Trail. Big Frog Motorway between Big Creek Truck Trail and Jacks River Truck Trail. Jacks River Truck Trail between Sheeds-Sylco Truck Trail and Big Frog Motorway.

In Polk County, Tennessee, for protection of damage to road:
Smith Mountain Truck Trail between Kimsey Forest Highway and McFarland Truck Trail.

In Monroe County, Tennessee, for game management purposes:
Cantrell Truck Trail between Rocky Branch Gap and Bald River. Tipton Knob Truck Trail between Tellico River Forest Highway and Beaverdam Bald. Double Camp Truck Trail between Citico Truck Trail and the north terminus. Sycamore Truck Trail between Sycamore Creek and North River Truck Trail.

The following roads in Monroe county will be closed from October 1 to December 31 of each year for game management purposes:
North River Truck Trail between Tellico River Forest Highway and Cane Creek Truck Trail. Citico Truck Trail between the National Forest boundary on the north and Rafter Truck Trail.

Persons residing in the National Forest and using these roads to and from their homes are not required to register or secure a permit, but an identification permit will be issued upon request. The closures named herein are not applicable to the normal travel of such persons.
