**Talc Testing Shafts Sunk On Marble Land**

Officials there believe that talc, which is usually found near Marble deposits, can be mined successfully on the property. Mr. Bailey says that the vein which he is now operating five miles below Murphy on the Nolita river, and which lies within the territory to be inundated by the waters to be backed up by the TVA's \$22,000,000 Hiwassee dam when it is completed, is the same as the one running through the marble company property. The site of the prospecting shaft is about 150 yards in front of the Marble company offices at a marble quarry site.

**Elections To Be Held In County On Tuesday**

Continued from front page... the county ticket with its state capitol and local officials; the township tickets for justice of the peace and constables, and constitutional amendments, ballots. Says Everything Ready Despite the turmoil of an intensive campaign by both parties, Fred O. Bates, chairman of the Cherokee County Board of Elections, announces that everything is in readiness for the voting as per schedule. Candidates and their helpers and party groups have circulated freely throughout the county and no section of it lacks a knowledge of the principal candidates. Leading the county ticket is the office of solicitor of the 20th judicial district which finds John M. Queet, incumbent of Waynesville, unopposed as the Democratic candidate. R. B. (Jack) Morphey, young Robbinville attorney who has served prominently in the state legislature on previous occasions, is the Democratic nominee for state senator from the 33rd senatorial district. He is opposed by McKinley Edwards, Bryson City attorney. Two Cherokee county attorneys are also running for representative. J. N. Moody, of Murphy, is the Democratic candidate while Clyde H. Jarrett, of Andrews, is on the Republican slate.

**Seek Sheriff Post** Heading the county ticket—or any other to be voted locally for that matter—is the office of sheriff and two of the strongest men politically in the county are seeking the post. L. L. Mason, incumbent, and prominent cattle dealer, is the Democratic candidate. He is opposed on the Republican ticket by J. C. Townson, Murphy business man and farmer. Both men are well-known and a bitter fight is being waged in their behalf. For clerk of the Superior court, John Donley, the Republican incumbent, is being opposed by Wirelow McIver, World War veteran and Murphy business man. B. L. Padgett, incumbent Democratic Register of Deeds, of Murphy, is seeking reelection over Henry A. Barton, Republican, who is connected with the Moore Supply company here. Three separate county tickets have been printed for the office of county commissioner, inasmuch as the county is divided into three separate county commissioner districts. District No. 1 comprises the Valleytown-Andrews area from Marble to Topton. Upon the death of S. H. Parker, Democratic candidate for the position of county commissioner, from the first district, it has not been learned who will oppose Henry G. Dills, Andrews citizen, who is the Republican nominee.

In the second district which comprises the Murphy area T. P. Calhoun, Regal, is the Democratic candidate and is being opposed by E. P. Hawkins, Murphy business man. T. T. Johnson is the candidate for Democratic commissioner in the third district which includes the communities in the lower end of county. He is opposed by J. M. Anderson. Seven members of the county board of education are to be elected and seven names appear on the Democratic ticket. They are: Mrs. G. W. Cover, B. M. Harbin, E. L. Shields, E. B. King, B. E. Palmer, J. T. Hayes and Lawson Lunsford. There are three Republican candidates for the office. They are: J. W. Axley, D. V. Carringer and B. L. Fox. For county surveyor Lon Raper, of Oak Park, is the Democratic candidate, while O. G. Anderson, of Culberson, is the Republican candidate. Dr. Harry Miller, of Murphy, is the Democratic candidate for coroner, while Dr. Fred L. Herbert incumbent of Andrews, is the Republican candidate. Incumbent Senator R. Reynolds is the candidate for that office on the Democratic state ticket. He is opposed by Charles A. Jones. Likewise Zebulon Weaver, of Asheville, the incumbent congressman from the 11th district, is seeking reelection. His opponent is Vonno L. Gudgeon, also of Asheville. Democratic candidates for Superior court judges in the 21 districts of

the state are unopposed on the state ticket as are the candidates for attorney general, commissioner of labor and utilities commissioner. Three Democratic candidates for associate justice of the supreme court are: M. V. Barnhill, J. Wallace Wimborne and A. A. F. Seawell. Two Republican candidates are: Herbert F. Seawell, Jr., and Ervin B. Tucker. Two constitution amendments will be voted on in the election. They are: an amendment making the term of office of sheriff and coroner four years instead of the present two-year term, and an amendment for or against a department of justice. There are five township ballots to be voted on. In the Murphy township Ezra Price is Democratic candidate for constable. He is opposed by S. D. Stiles. On the same ballot Evert Hall is unopposed as Republican candidate for Justice of the Peace. In Valleytown township, H. H. Hyde, is seeking the office of justice of the peace on the Republican ticket and is unopposed. In Beaverdam township Clifford G. Rose is the Republican candidate for constable. Jerry Jenkins has announced for the same office on an independent ticket. In Shoal Creek township J. C. Wright is the Democratic candidate for constable against O. J. West, Republican candidate. Guy H. Hyatt, Republican candidate for constable in Nolita township is unopposed.
