State-U.S. To Test **Mountain Section Seeking Minerals** 

National defense officials have been asked by the State Board of Conservation and Development to investigate olivene deposits in Western North Carolina.

Huge deposits of olivene are said to exist in this section. Until recently they were considered worthless, but new processes have proved olivene to be a source of magnesium which is used in airplanes, bombs and other war materials, and also a source of epsom salts.

A letter from Governor Broughton says a special fund of \$3,000 has been set aside by the State, and matched by the U.S. Government, to look into mineral deposits in this section, with especial reference to feldspar, mica, kaolin and quartz.

The Governor asked that any land owner who thinks his property contains minerals that are valuable, send samples to Dr. Jasper L. Stucky State Geologist, in Raleigh.
